UNPAID STATIONERY

HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION CONSULTATION

Every two years, our school is required to consult with the community regarding what we teach in the health and physical education curriculum.

In health and physical education, the focus is on the well being of the students themselves, of other people and of society through learning in health-related and movement topics.

The key areas of learning are:

Personal health and physical development

Movement concepts and motor skills

Relationships with other people

Healthy communities and environments

Learning about pubertal change begins at Curriculum level 4 (Years 5&6).

Parents will be notified well in advance and have the option to withdraw their children from pubertal change sessions.
